Community Health Workers

Earlier this year, in partnership with UPMC Health Plan and the Allegheny County Health Department, Familylinks launched a Community Health Worker (CHW) program. The goal of this program is to improve health outcomes for Allegheny County residents who face significant health disparities by increasing their access to critical health information, healthcare services, and community resources related to key social determinants of health. Using a person-centered and culturally competent approach, CHWs help clients achieve meaningful improvements in their overall health and well-being, including their ability to live safely and independently in their homes.

The CHW program is being implemented in tandem with two longtime Familylinks programs: Options Care Management, which helps adults age 60+ remain as independent as possible, and Supports Coordination, which helps children and adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities and/or autism secure the services they need to be safe, healthy, and successful.

In addition to serving clients in these programs, the CHW program can also work with the other members of their household, ensuring the well-being of the entire family.

Our goal is to serve at least 200 individuals throughout the first year of the program. Pictured to the right is the CHW team!
